Madison Heights, MI // The nationwide Rock the Vote bus tour has scheduled stops in Roseville and Detroit in conjunction with the United Food and Commercial Workers (UFCW) Local 876 Voter Registration Drive.

"UFCW Local 876 and Rock the Vote share a common goal, registering as many voters as possible and encouraging individuals to have their voices heard by exercising their right to vote in the upcoming elections," Andy Johnson, Local 876's president, said.
