REPORT INJURIES AND ILLNESSES TO YOUR EMPLOYER

IF YOU SUFFER AN INJURY OR ILLNESS ON THE JOB, IT MUST BE REPORTED IMMEDIATELY TO YOUR EMPLOYER. IT IS ILLEGAL FOR THE EMPLOYER TO RETALIATE AGAINST YOU IN ANY WAY FOR REPORTING AN INJURY OR ILLNESS. BY REPORTING YOUR INJURY OR ILLNESS, YOU WILL RECEIVE THE PROTECTIONS OFFERED UNDER THE LAW INCLUDING MEDICAL TREATMENT AND BENEFITS UNDER WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

REPORT INJURIES AND ILLNESSES TO YOUR LOCAL UNION

IT IS EQUALLY IMPORTANT TO REPORT TO YOUR LOCAL UNION THAT YOU SUFFERED AN INJURY OR ILLNESS ON THE JOB. YOUR LOCAL UNION WILL MAKE SURE YOU ARE EDUCATED ABOUT YOUR RIGHTS UNDER OSHA AND WORKERS COMPENSATION AND ARE PROTECTED BY YOUR UNION CONTRACT. THIS WAY, YOUR UNION CAN MAKE SURE YOUR RIGHTS TO PROPER MEDICAL TREATMENT AND TO WORKERS COMPENSATION BENEFITS ARE PROTECTED.
